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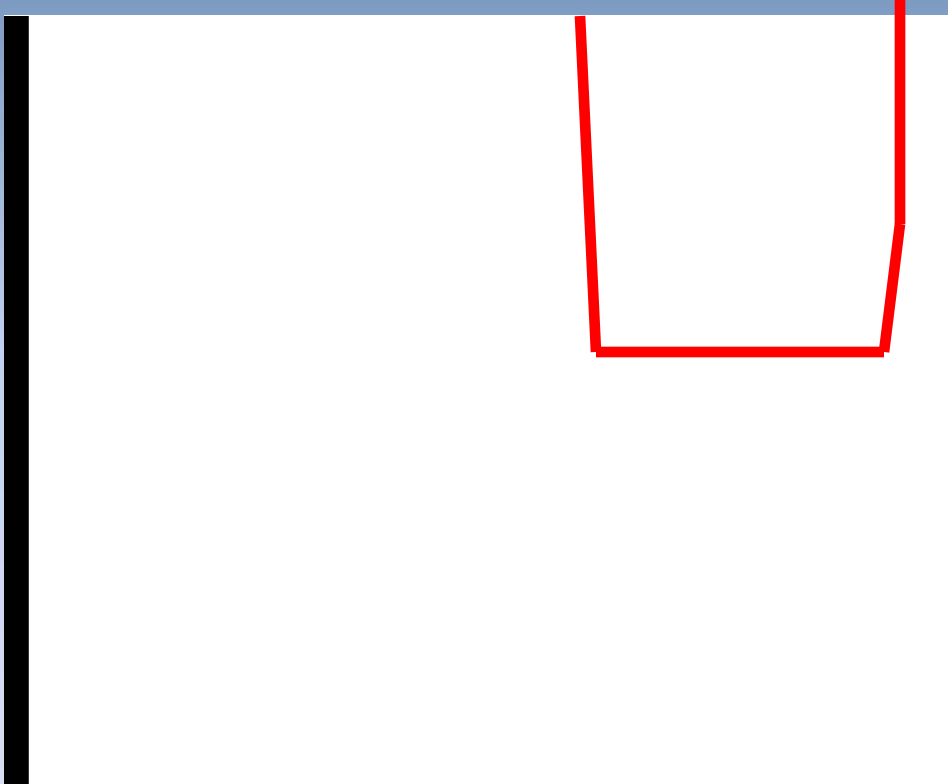
Invasive Species Programs

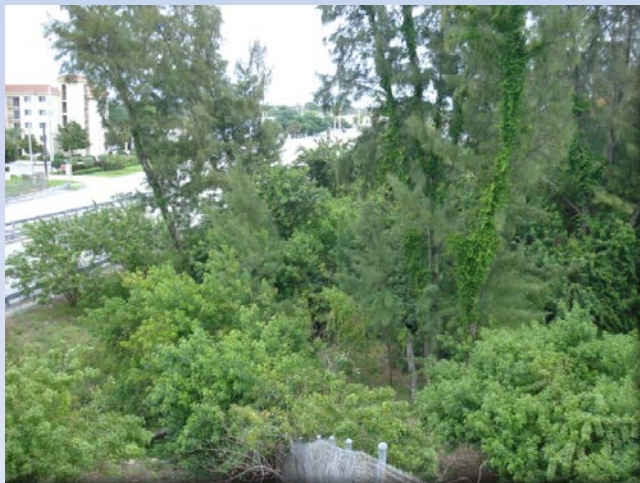
I-95 at McNab Road/C-14 Canal
