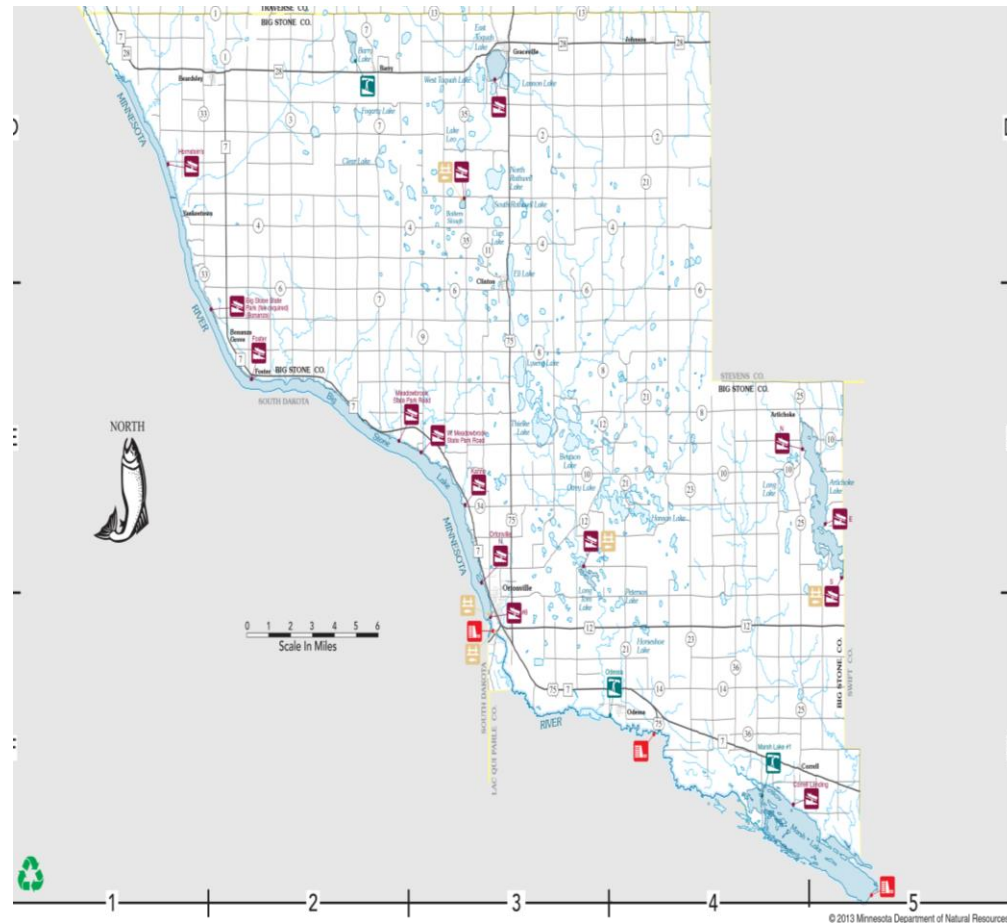


In 2015-2016, Big Stone County received \$79,547 in AIS Prevention Aid.

*65 adults received AIS Education, including local stakeholders and lake organization

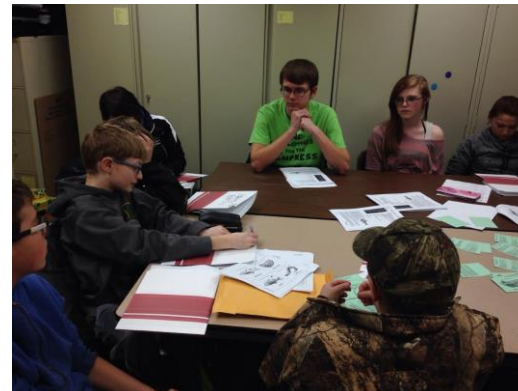
*100 fishermen received AIS prevention packets during local Big Stone Lake fishing tournaments
