Jointed goatgrass (Aegilops cylindrica)

Appearance: A winter annual grass that can

Foliage: Leaves are alternate on the stem, up to 0.5 in. wide with thin hairs along the

reach 4 ft. tall and is bent at the lower nodes.

Flowering Head: Flower heads are red or straw-colored spikes. Spikes are cylindrical and contain 2-12 segments per spike.

Fruit/Seeds: The segments have awns (threadlike bristles) with the longest awns at the top of the spike. At maturity the seed heads break into individual segments.

Oxeye Daisy

(Laucanthemum vulgare)

Appearance: A perennial herb that can reach 1-3 ft. tall.

Foliage: Leaves at the base of the plant are spoon-shaped. Leaves on the stem are alternate, 1-4 in. long, toothed (or lobed) and decrease in size closer to the top of the stem.

Flowering Head: Produces 1-40 flowering stems with daisy-like yellow and white flower heads, 1-2 in. across.

Fruit/Seeds: Each flower head can produce up to 200 flat seeds that are 0.08in. long.

Yellow bluestem

(Bothriochloa ischaemum)

Appearance: A perennial, tufted grass that can grow from 3-5 ft. tall.

Foliage: Leaves are at the base of the plant, glaucous, flat, and 1-10 in. long with scattered hairs. Stems are slender and green turning yellow when mature with brown to purple nodes.

Flowering Head: Flowers on 3-12, 3 in. long, fan-shaped, slivery-red to purple heads at the top of the stem.

Fruit/Seeds: Seeds are brown in color and attached to a silvery tuft of hair.

Leafy spurge

(Euphorbia esula)

Appearance: An erect, perennial, herbaceous plant that grows from 2-3.5 ft. tall. Several stems emerge from the base and are smooth and bluish-green. The plant produces a toxic milky sap if the stem is broken or a leaf is removed.

Foliage: Leaves are lance shaped, smooth and 1-4 in. long.

Flowers: Yellow flowers develop in clusters at the top of the plant.

Fruit: 3 lobed capsules that explode when mature.
